


Please rate the following areas of the College as per your opinion:



The above chart indicated that the majority of alumni (79.9%, consisting of "Excellent" and "Very Good" ratings) had expressed a positive perception of the College's infrastructure. This suggests that the College is providing well-maintained and equipped facilities that meet the needs of the students.



Count of Please rate the following areas of the college as per your opinion: [Teaching and Learning]




The majority of alumni (98.5%) rated the teaching and learning experience as either "Excellent" (49.2%) or "Very Good" (38.5%). This high level of satisfaction indicates a strong emphasis on diverse teaching approaches, effectively balancing theoretical knowledge with practical application. Additionally, incorporating technology to enhance learning further contributes to the positive perception of the academic environment. Only a tiny fraction (1.5%) of alumni rated the teaching and learning as "Average." This suggests a generally positive perception of the teaching and learning quality.


Count of Please rate the following areas of the college as per your opinion: [Growth opportunities for students]




The chart above predicted that 40% of the respondents rated the growth opportunities "Excellent." This suggests a significant portion of the student body feels optimistic about the available growth prospects, and 38.5% of students view growth opportunities as "Very Good." While smaller than the previous two categories, 16.9% of students rated growth opportunities as "Good." This suggests a moderate level of satisfaction with the available options. Only 1.5% of responses are relatively insignificant. The combined percentage of students rating the opportunities as "Excellent" or "Very Good" is a substantial 78.5%, indicating high satisfaction.



The majority of the alumni (over 60%) rated the industrial exposure as either "Very Good" or "Excellent," indicating an overall intense satisfaction. A smaller percentage found it to be "Good," while very few rated it as "Satisfactory" or "Average." This suggests that the College's efforts in providing industrial exposure during the study period have been well-received, with room for some improvement to address the needs of those who were less satisfied.






The pie chart above represents the students' opinions about the "Learning value" of their College, focusing on knowledge, concepts, and skills acquired. The majority of students (52.3%) rated the learning value as "Excellent," followed by "Very Good" (32.3%). A smaller percentage found it




The pie chart illustrates students' opinions on the significance of the courses they took at the College. A majority of students (47.7%) rated the courses as "Excellent," while 33.8% considered them "Very Good." A smaller percentage (15.4%) found the courses to be "Good," and only 1.5% rated them as "Excellent, Very Good," which suggests a positive perception of the courses among the students surveyed.



The data reveals students' opinions on the College's curriculum updates. Most students (47.7%) rated the updates positively, with "Very Good" being the most common response. A smaller percentage expressed satisfaction with "Excellent" (35.4%), "Good" (12.3%), and "Satisfactory" (3.1%). Only a tiny minority (1.5%) found the updates "Average." These results indicate a generally favorable view of the curriculum updates among the students.



The pie chart illustrates students' opinions on how well the college curriculum aligns with their career goals. The largest segment of respondents (38.5%) rated the curriculum as "Excellent" in this regard, followed by "Very Good" (38.5%). A smaller percentage (21.5%) found the curriculum to be "Good," while only 1.5% rated it as "Satisfactory." Thus, the data suggests a positive perception of the curriculum's suitability for achieving students' career aspirations.



The above bar chart presents students' overall assessments of the College. Most students rated the College highly, with "Excellent" being the most frequent response.
